

I extended my own comments on the loss of John Poffenberger and the ceremony that we shared our respects and Honors to John and his wife Carolyn. 13 members were in attendance.


Old Business



Using I-81 from the north or south:

FROM **I-81** south to "old" exit 3 at **PA Rt. 16.** Continue **East on PA 16** to Waynesboro. Go through Waynesboro **East on PA 16**. Before you start to "go up the mountain", you will see **RED RUN PARK ON THE LEFT.**

Using US 15 from the north or south:

GUACAMOLE from Carol Samuelsen

2 Haas Avocados - scoop out fruit and mash 1/2 plum tomato - chopped fine Juice of 1/4 lime 1/8 tsp. garlic powder 1/2 tsp. salt 1 Tbs. sour cream

PULLED/BAR-B-Q PORK

From the recipe book of Jim Wilhelm

NOTE – "Pork Butt" is the butchers name for the top half of a fresh pork shoulder. They have no skin and relatively little fat for their volume. The only bone is the shoulder blade (very little loss). Butts are usually sold as country style spareribs. The butcher will usually sell whole butts at the same price because he doesn't have to cut them for country style spare ribs. A butt will weigh 6 to 8 pounds. The butcher may slice the butt into steaks if you ask, they do not look as nice as pork chops but taste the same at about 1/4 the price. If you have him cut it into two equal size pieces, they make good roasts, again, not pretty but taste like more. I watch grocery store ads for sales, I buy when they have a sale and freeze. Expect to find pork butts on sale at \$0.99 per pound.

<u>Pulled Pork</u> - Place the butt (or smaller roast) in a covered roaster, fat side up, with water about half way up the butt, no need to add seasoning. Bake at 225 for 7 or 8 hours, or until pork falls apart. A metal rack under the butt aids in its removal from the roaster. Place butt on a cutting board and cut into chunky pieces, discard fat as you go, and serve.







<u>Pork Bar-B-Q</u> - Prepare butt as per Pulled Pork. Instead of cutting into chunky pieces, use two large serving forks to shred the pork. Add a bottle of Sweet Baby Ray Bar-B-Q Sauce and stir well. Serve on round buns with chips.

Dad says proudly, "Her brother is a United States Submariner!"








Flag-Folding Procedures From the American Legion

The traditional method of folding the flag is as follows:

(A) Straighten out the flag to full length and fold lengthwise once.



(B) Fold it lengthwise a second time to meet the open edge, making sure that the union of stars on the blue field remains outward in full view. (A large flag may have to be folded lengthwise a third time.)



(C) A triangular fold is then started by bringing the striped corner of the folded edge to the open edge.



(D) The outer point is then turned inward, parallel with the open edge, to form a second triangle.



(E) The diagonal or triangular folding is continued toward the blue union until the end is reached, with only the blue showing and the form being that of a cocked (three-corner) hat.



Meaning of Flag-Folding Program

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our great country was originally founded.

The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing states our veterans served in uniform. The canton field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted only when draped as a pall on the casket of a veteran who has served our country honorably in uniform.







In the U.S. Armed Forces, at the ceremony of retreat, the flag is lowered, folded in a triangle fold and kept under watch throughout the night as a tribute to our nation's honored dead. The next morning it is brought out and, at the ceremony of reveille, run aloft as a symbol of our belief in the resurrection of the body.

Symbols for the Folds of the Flag

The **first** fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The **second** fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The **third** fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The **fourth** fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.

The **fifth** fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The **sixth** fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The **seventh** fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The **eighth** fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The **ninth** fold is a tribute to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

The **10th** fold is a tribute to father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born.

The **11th** fold, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The **12th** fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under Gen. George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under







Capt. John Paul Jones and were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the U.S. Armed Forces, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

50 - 50 \$33 was won by Dana & Roxanne Bostwick.

The meeting was ended with our closing prayer (Lost Harbor).
